Folsom Street Events (FSE) invites your organization to apply to become a beneficiary of our 2010 event season. Proceeds from Bay of Pigs™, Up Your Alley®, Magnitude®, and Folsom Street Fair® will benefit your nonprofit agency. Applications are **due no later than 12:00pm on Friday, February 5, 2010** at 965 Mission Street, Suite 200, San Francisco, CA, 94103. Electronic versions of the 2010 Beneficiary Application are available on our website at www.folsomstreetevents.org as a PDF file.

There are three categories of annual grant-making: Major Beneficiary, Supporting Beneficiary, and National Community Grants. Please review each category carefully to ensure that your agency meets the basic qualifications, including volunteer recruitment. National Community Grants are made on an invitation basis only; please do not use this application for a request.

Generally, eligible nonprofits may apply every year for beneficiary status, and FSE shall consider requests that include program salaries, operating expenses (e.g. rent, utilities), and capacity building projects. The only exception to this rule is any agency that has been funded for three years in a row. For example, if your charity has benefited from our events in 2007, 2008 and 2009, then you are not eligible for this grant cycle.

FOLSOM STREET EVENTS – 2010 BENEFICIARY APPLICATION

INTRODUCTION

Folsom Street Events (FSE) produces four events: Bay of Pigs, Up Your Alley, Magnitude, and Folsom Street Fair. Folsom Street Fair is the world's largest leather and fetish event. Last year, well over 300,000 people attended the 26TH Folsom Street Fair, making it possible for our organization to return more than **\$333,000** to local and national charities. All of our events are adult-oriented, sex-positive fetish events. Beneficiary organizations must consider and accept these aspects of our events prior to applying. Folsom Street Events has donated over \$4 million since its inception 26 years ago.

FSE encourages all interested and eligible organizations to submit a beneficiary application for the 2010 event season. The eligibility requirements, process, important dates, application requirements and application checklist are included. The primary responsibility of each accepted applicant organization is to provide quality, motivated volunteers. In return for providing volunteers, the organization will receive funding for an approved purpose, as described in the application.

OUR MISSION

To create high-quality, volunteer-driven leather and fetish events that provide the adult alternative lifestyle community with safe venues for self expression, emphasizing fun, frolic, and fetish while raising funds to benefit local and national charities.

ELIGIBILITY REQUIREMENTS FOR MAJOR BENEFICIARIES

Major beneficiaries provide the bulk of our event volunteers, and, in return, receive the greatest share of our events' proceeds. Generally, grants in this category range from \$10,000 – \$25,000.

In order to apply as a Major Beneficiary, your organization MUST:

1. Hold a valid IRS 501(c)3 tax exemption
2. Serve the City and County of San Francisco in the areas of Health, Human Services, or The Arts
3. Meet the following organizational capacity requirements*:
 - A. Annual operating budget – Greater than \$500,000
 - B. Board of Directors – Greater than 8 members
 - C. Paid staff – Greater than 3.0 FTEs
 - D. Active volunteer corps – Greater than 100 people
 - E. Successful track record in recruiting and engaging FSE volunteers

**If an agency does not meet all five criteria, then an explanation must be provided to justify how the agency can serve as a successful Major Beneficiary.*
4. Be willing, ready, and able to help heavily promote our events
5. Regularly access email and the Internet (with ability to open Adobe .PDF files)
6. Provide 15 – 30 volunteers for Up Your Alley, 5 – 10 volunteers for Magnitude, and 30 – 50 volunteers for Folsom Street Fair (not including two "Super Volunteer" shifts for each fair)

For Major Beneficiaries, Folsom Street Events does NOT support:

1. Political campaigns, government agencies, or for-profit entities
 2. Agencies or programs located outside the San Francisco city limits
 3. Fundraising or capital campaigns
- (We fund Programs/Services or Administration expenses only.)

ELIGIBILITY REQUIREMENTS FOR SUPPORTING BENEFICIARIES

Supporting beneficiaries provide a supplemental pool of event volunteers, and, in return, receive an appropriate share of the event proceeds. Generally, grants in this category range from \$2,500 – \$7,500. This category has been created for those agencies that do not or cannot meet the Major Beneficiary capacity requirements but can still provide volunteer support for our events.

FOLSOM STREET EVENTS – 2010 BENEFICIARY APPLICATION

In order to apply as a Supporting Beneficiary, your organization MUST:

1. Hold a valid IRS 501(c)3 tax exemption
2. Serve one of the six counties of the San Francisco Bay Area (San Francisco, Alameda, Marin, Contra Costa, San Mateo, Santa Clara) in the areas of Health, Human Services, or The Arts
3. Be willing, ready, and able to help heavily promote our events
4. Regularly access email and the Internet (with ability to open Adobe .PDF files)
5. Provide 5 – 15 volunteers for Up Your Alley and 10 – 25 volunteers for Folsom Street Fair (not including one “Super Volunteer” shift for each fair)

For Supporting Beneficiaries, Folsom Street Events does NOT support:

1. Political campaigns, government agencies, or for-profit entities
2. Agencies or programs located outside the San Francisco Bay Area
3. Fundraising or capital campaigns

(We fund Programs/Services or Administration expenses only.)

ELIGIBILITY REQUIREMENTS FOR NATIONAL COMMUNITY GRANTS

On a limited, invitation-only basis, Folsom Street Events will accept grant requests from nonprofit agencies that support the priority areas of Health, Human Services, The Arts and/or Support of the Leather/Fetish Community. Generally, grants in this category range from \$150 – \$3,000. This category seeks to expand our philanthropic reach and to support worthwhile nonprofit projects on a national basis. Please DO NOT use this application process to apply for a National Community Grant.

APPLICATION INSTRUCTIONS

Applications must be submitted in writing on your agency’s letterhead. **Applications must be received by FSE at 965 Mission Street, Suite 200, SF, CA, 94103 by 12:00pm on Friday, February 5, 2010.**

- Four (4) points of contact must be listed with each application including Board President, Executive Director, Event Coordinator and an Alternative Contact (must be full-time staff).
- All applications must be signed by your Executive Director and Board President.
- Applications received by fax, email or *after* the deadline will **not** be considered.
- Four (4) complete sets of Sections A – C and one complete set of Section D.

FUNDING COMMITMENT

FSE’s ability to generate funds is dependent on factors that cannot be predicted or guaranteed, including weather, etc. If it becomes necessary for FSE to cancel one or more of our events, the amount to be paid out may be a prorated percentage of the original award amount. Final awards are made based on the amount requested, number and quality of volunteers provided, and other relevant performance factors.

VOLUNTEERS

Folsom Street Events depends on over 800 volunteer shifts to help produce Bay of Pigs, Up Your Alley, Magnitude, and Folsom Street Fair. We expect Major and Supporting Beneficiaries to:

- Work closely with the FSE staff and Board of Directors. Each organization’s primary contact person is expected to recruit, inform, schedule and motivate his/her volunteers.
- Attend scheduled planning meetings throughout the spring and summer and for Super Volunteers to work the **half of the entire day** (5:00 AM to 10:00 PM of each Fair).
- Schedule regular volunteers into various shifts of ranging from approximately 4 – 6 hours.
- Provide required skills in a variety of areas. It is the responsibility of each agency to ensure pledged volunteers attend a **MANDATORY** orientation and are aware and capable of performing the type of tasks needed. Volunteer duties will be provided. Limited shifts are available for disabled persons.

SELECTION NOTIFICATION

Determination letters will be mailed the week of March 1ST, 2010. Acceptance letters will include a contract, detailing volunteer information, a schedule of dates and deadlines and other important beneficiary information. **Organizations selected for funding are required to promote all events in various agency publications and provide a link from their web site to FSE’s website.**

SECTION E – Submission Review

- E1. Sections A, B & C of your application **MUST** not exceed four (4) pages (**8.5" x 11", single-sided, 1" margin, and 10 point Arial font**). Submissions that ignore these limitations may be returned without review by FSE.
- E2. Applications missing any of the required attachments and/or with omitted answers may be returned.
- E3. Items in Section D must clearly indicate your organization's name and relevant dates/information.
- E4. Include a copy of this completed checklist with your application.
- E5. Include FOUR (4) complete sets of Sections A – C and one complete set of Section D.
